






Epiphany

Some families celebrate 3 Kings Day also known as Ephiphany.



This holiday is celebrated as the day the three wise men first saw baby Jesus and brought him gifts.



On this day, many children get their Christmas presents.



Before children go to sleep on January 5, they leave a box with hay under their beds so the kings will leave good presents.



In France they make a bread known as la galette des rois is baked. Bakers hide a coin, jewel, or little toy inside it. In Hispanic cultures they call this bread, Rosca De Reyes.



3 Kings Day is celebrated with a number of traditions.



ROSCA DE REYES

Traditional sweet yeast bread primarily consumed on January 6th during the Kings Day festivities. Made to resemble a king's crown with candied fruit for the jewels.. Traditionally, a small porcelain figurine that represents baby Jesus is wrapped in wax paper and baked into the batter.



Grass or Hay



Each January 5th, kids join their parents to cut fresh grass and set it in a shoebox under their beds, under the Christmas tree.



Gather with Family

For many families, Three Kings Day is as big of a celebration as Christmas Day. It's customary to gather with friends and family to celebrate, often by opening gifts, playing music, and sharing a large meal together.



3 Kings Day is celebrated with a number of traditions.



Shoes

Children leave their shoes outside the door so the Kings will leave their gifts inside them.



Grass & Water



Kids will leave out grass and water for The Three King's Camels to eat and drink.
